Let's make a George Seurat inspired pointillism drawing



Georges-Pierre Seurat was a French post-Impressionist artist. He is best known for devising the painting technique known as pointillism.


Pointillism is a technique of painting in which small distinct dots of color are applied in patterns to form an image.

Supplies Needed: White Sheet of Paper Pencil Eraser Colored Markers



Step One
Grab your pencil & draw a head by making a circle in the middle of the page.
Next draw in a torso.

Draw eyes into the face by making two circles. Draw in pupils by making two smaller circles within the larger circles. Add eyelashes. Next draw the ears by making two semicircles on opposite sides of the face. Choose a hairstyle & add hair to the face.




Step Three Draw in a mask 😂!

Face masks are one of the most powerful weapons we have to slow down & stop the spread of the COVID 19 virus. We all have a responsibility to protect ourselves, our families, & our communities!

Step Four
Grab a marker & color in
your mask . Use any color
of your liking.

Step Five
Let's begin to add color &
give shape to our drawing
by using the pointillism
technique. Begin with the
eyes. Add color by making
dots. Keep adding small
dots.

Step Six
Continue adding dots to
your drawing \(\strice \) to give it
color & shape. Add dots to
the face & hair until the
entire area is complete.







Step Seven
Continue adding dots to
your drawing ... Give your
drawing some detail by
adding dots using a
different colored marker.





You are done! You have just created a George Seurat inspired pointillism drawing!



"A Sunday Afternoon on the Island of La Grande Jatte" painted from 1884 to 1886, is Georges Seurat's most famous work & is a leading example of his pointillist technique.
