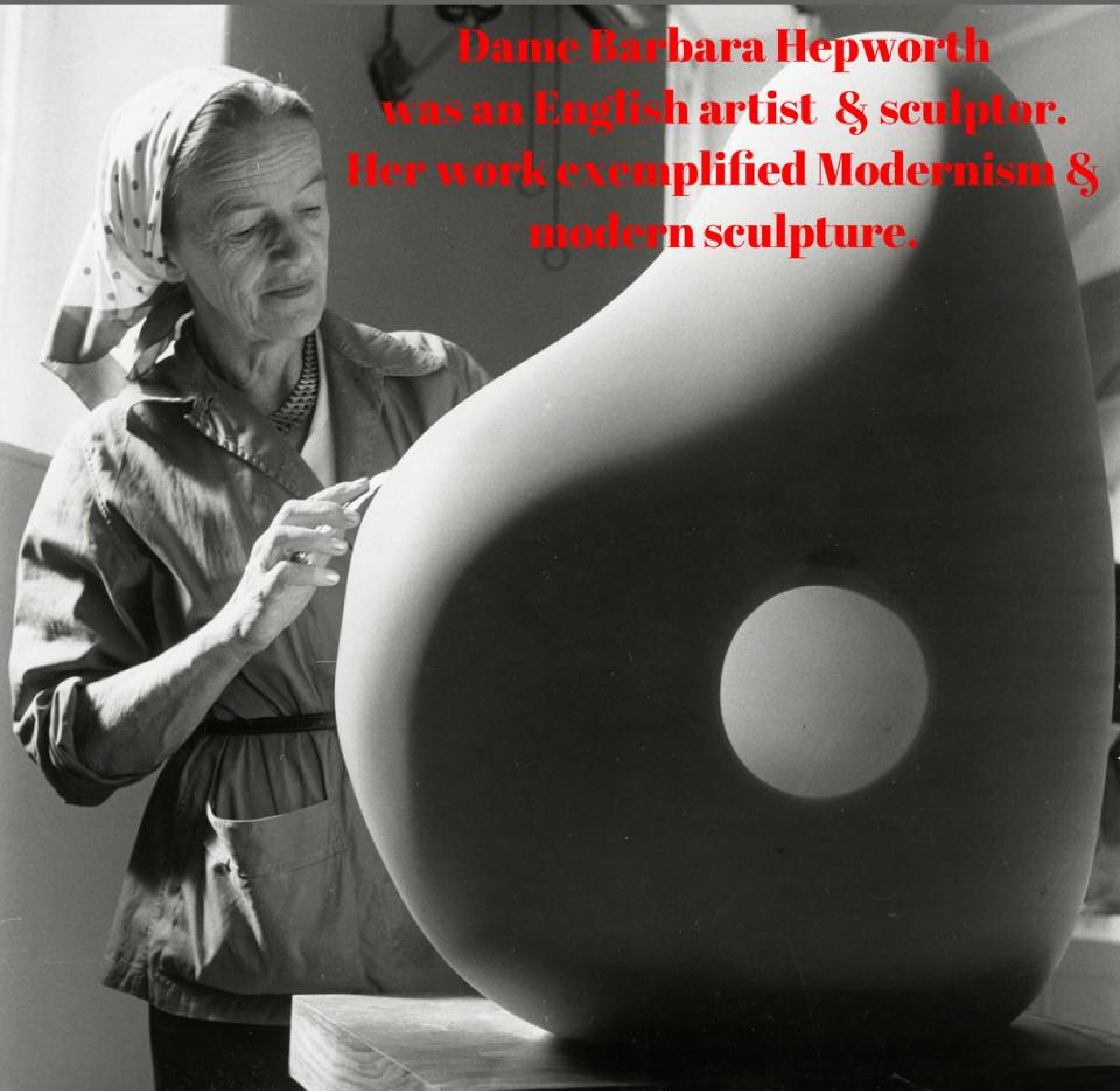

**LET'S CREATE A
BARBARA HEPWORTH
INSPIRED NECKLACE**

You will need the following supplies:

Crayola Air Dry Clay

1 piece of String

1 Pencil

1 Paintbrush

1 Toothpick

Paint

**Grab some
Crayola Air Dry Clay &
Roll it out!**

**Roll out your clay and
form a ball.**



Once you have formed a circle press down on the clay with your fingers to begin to flatten it.



Now that your clay is flat begin to give it shape. Use your fingers to form a heart shape.



Now that your heart shape is formed, Grab the back of your pencil & press down into the clay.



Create a hole in the clay wide enough to look through.



Next grab a toothpick & press it into your clay.



Create the hole on the top right hand corner.

Now we wait!
**You must allow your Air
Dry Clay to harden for
about 30-45 minutes.**





Now let's paint our heart. Grab a brush & any color of paint.



Paint one side & let it dry. Once it's dry, paint the opposite side.



Allow the paint to dry.
Once the paint is dry,
measure how long you
want the necklace to
hang.



Cut the string & run
your string through the
hole at the top right
hand of the heart.



Now you can see the world through your very own unique necklace inspired by Barbara Hepworth's sculptures.
